<u>Accountable to</u>	Reaching Communities Team Leader
<u>Responsible for</u>	No line management responsibility
<u>Geographical Area</u>	Wiltshire, flexibly based at Semington Carers Centre or Salisbury Carers Centre
<u>Hours of Work</u>	22.5 hours per week plus occasional weekend/evening
<u>Grade</u>	Allied to NJC scale Grade five, scale point 24 – 27 (£21,530 – £23,698)
<u>Contract</u>	Fixed term to 31 March 2018

Purpose of the Post

To plan, facilitate and deliver carer clinics and drop-ins in the community mainly in GP practices but occasionally in other settings.

Key duties and responsibilities:

1. To plan, facilitate and deliver a full programme of carer health clinics in GP surgeries in Wiltshire in support of the Investors in Care programme
2. To work closely with practice staff on the design and delivery of the clinics including invitations to carers
3. Complete an initial assessment of the carer through a focused interview
4. Give relevant information / advice / signposting
5. Maintain accurate, timely and detailed records of all referrals and re-referrals, including initial assessments and on-going actions on Charitylog and/or other reporting systems as required
6. Manage own caseload, liaising with line manager and specialist workers as required
7. Maintain accurate, timely and detailed records of all work undertaken on Charitylog and/or other reporting systems as required
8. Attend regular supervision meetings, to share good practice and ensure your own support needs are met
9. Attend regular one to one line management meetings

Additional Occasional Responsibilities

As a member of a small team, the post holder will be expected as necessary to support colleagues by:

- Identifying appropriate sources of information, advice, benefits, equipment and services which carers can access, and updating shared resource information to reflect this
- Actively contribute and participate in publicity events and represent Carer Support Wiltshire in a positive manner and to raise awareness of carers' needs

General Requirements

The post holder will be expected to:

- Possess the essential skills as detailed in the person specification
- Adhere to and uphold Carer Support Wiltshire's mission, vision, values, strategic aims and policies
- Act with integrity and maintain the highest professional standards at all times
- Maintain a confidential, sensitive and discrete approach to personal, sensitive and organisational information
- Contribute to a culture of equality and demonstrate a commitment to removing all forms of discrimination as a colleague and as a provider of services to carers
- To work collaboratively as a member of a small team including volunteers and to attend and actively contribute to team meetings
- Actively identify own training needs and personal development, and to participate in training sessions when required
- A flexible approach is required for this role and you may be asked to undertake other duties from time to time as determined by your line manager and in keeping with the purpose of the post and after consultation with the post holder

The job description will be reviewed regularly including at annual appraisals and may be changed in the light of the needs of the organisation and following consultation with the post-holder
